A By-law of The Corporation of the City of Barrie to enhance compliance with its by-laws respecting the speed of vehicles in Community Safety and School zones through means of an Administrative Penalty System within the municipality

WHEREAS Section 8 of the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25 (“The Municipal Act, 2001”) provides that the powers of a municipality shall be interpreted broadly so as to confer broad authority on the municipality to enable the municipality to govern its affairs as it considers appropriate and to enhance the municipality’s ability to respond to municipal issues;

AND WHEREAS Section 9 of the Municipal Act, 2001 provides that a municipality has the capacity, rights, powers and privileges of a natural person for the purpose of exercising the authority under the Act;

AND WHEREAS Section 10(1) of the Municipal Act, 2001 provides that a single-tier municipality may pass by-laws respecting matters within the spheres of jurisdiction set out therein;

AND WHEREAS Section 434.1 of the Municipal Act 2001 permits a municipality to require a Person to pay an Administrative Penalty if the municipality is satisfied that the Person has failed to comply with a by-law of the municipality passed under the Municipal Act;

AND WHEREAS this by-law shall be subject to the rules and procedures included in the *Highway Traffic Act R.S.O. 1990, c. H. 8*, as amended (the “*Highway Traffic Act, 1990*”), and its regulations;

AND WHEREAS Section 21.1 of the *Highway Traffic Act* provides for the use of Administrative Penalties in order to promote compliance with the *Act*;

AND WHEREAS Ontario Regulation 355/22, as amended, provides for the use of Administrative Penalties for camera based offences;

AND WHEREAS Ontario Regulation 398/19, as amended, provides for the use of Automated Speed Enforcement camera systems in community safety zones designated by by-law passed under section 214.1 (1) of the *Highway Traffic Act*, where the prescribed rate of speed is less than 80 kilometres per hour, or in school zones designated by by-law under clause 128 (5) (a).2017, c. 9, s. 5 of the *Highway Traffic Act*;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to motion 24-G-100 the Council of The Corporation of the City of Barrie has deemed it expedient to implement an Administrative Penalty System which is fair, transparent and an alternative method to adjudicate Contraventions and enhance compliance with its by-laws respecting the speed of vehicles in Community Safety Zones and School Zones within the City of Barrie;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of The Corporation of the City of Barrie enacts as follows:

1.0.0.0.0 **DEFINITIONS**

1.1.0.0.0 For the purpose of this by-law, where words and phrases used in this By-law are not defined herein but are defined in the *Highway Traffic Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. H. 8, as amended from time to time or any successor thereof (the *HTA*), the definitions in the *HTA* shall apply.

1.1.1.0.0 **ADMINISTRATIVE FEE** – means any fee(s) specified in Schedule “A” of this By-law, as may be amended from time to time;

1.1.2.0.0 **ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY** – means an Administrative Penalty as set out in Schedule “B” of this By-law, for a Contravention of Section 128 of the *Highway Traffic Act*.

1.1.3.0.0 **CLERK**– means the City Clerk, or anyone designated by the City Clerk to perform his or her duties pursuant to this By-law.

1.1.4.0.0 **CONTRACTOR** – means a third-party service provider who provides Automated Speed Enforcement camera systems which comply with Ontario Regulation 398/19.

- 1.1.5.0.0 **CONTRAVENTION** – a failure to comply with a provision of the maximum posted speed limit.
- 1.1.6.0.0 **EFFECTIVE DATE OF SERVICE** – means the 7th day from date of mailing of the Penalty Notice.
- 1.1.7.0.0 **FEES BY-LAW** – means the City of Barrie's Fees By-law, as may be amended from time to time, or any successor thereof.
- 1.1.8.0.0 **HEARING OFFICER** – means a Person appointed by the City from time to time to perform the functions of a Hearing Officer in accordance with this By-law and Ontario Regulation 355/22.
- 1.1.9.0.0 **HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT** – means the *Highway Traffic Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. H. 8, as amended from time to time or any successor thereof.
- 1.1.10.0.0 **HOLIDAY** – means a Saturday, Sunday and any statutory Holiday in the Province of Ontario or any day on which the offices of the City are officially closed for business.
- 1.1.11.0.0 **LATE PAYMENT FEE** – means an Administrative Fee established by Ontario Regulation 355/22 in respect of a Person's failure to pay an Administrative Penalty within the time prescribed in this By-law, as listed in Schedule "A".
- 1.1.12.0.0 **MTO SEARCH FEE** – means an Administrative Fee established by Ministry of Transportation for any search of the records of, or any inquiry to, the Ontario Ministry of Transportation, or related authority, for the purposes of obtaining vehicle plate ownership information, as listed in Schedule "A".
- 1.1.13.0.0 **NON-ATTENDANCE FEE** – means an Administrative Fee established by O. Reg 355/22 in respect of a Person's failure to appear at the time and place scheduled for a hearing before a Screening Officer or Hearing Officer, as listed in Schedule "A".
- 1.1.14.0.0 **NSF FEE** – means a fee established by the City, as set out in the Fees By-law, in respect of any payment to the City from a Person, for which there are insufficient funds available.
- 1.1.15.0.0 **OFFICER** – means a municipal employee designated by the Ministry of Transportation as a Provincial Offences Officer for the purpose of issuing charges and Penalty Orders under an Automated Speed Enforcement program.
- 1.1.16.0.0 **OWNER** – means the Person whose name appears on the vehicle plate portion of the ownership permit for the vehicle as provided by the Ontario Ministry of Transportation, and if the vehicle permit consists of a vehicle portion and a plate portion and different Persons are named on each portion, the Person whose names appears on the plate portion.
- 1.1.17.0.0 **PENALTY ORDER** – an order of an Officer set out in a Penalty Notice.
- 1.1.18.0.0 **PERSON** – includes an individual, sole proprietorship, partnership, limited partnership, trust or corporation, or an individual in his or her capacity as a trustee, executor, administrator or other legal representative.
- 1.1.19.0.0 **PROVINCIAL OFFENCES ACT** – means the *Provincial Offences Act*, R.S.O., 1990, c. P. 33, as amended from time to time, or any successor thereof
- 1.1.20.0.0 **SCREENING OFFICER** – means any Person appointed by the City Clerk or Director of Legislative and Court Services from time to time, to perform the functions of a Screening Officer pursuant to this By-law and Ontario Regulation 355/22.
- 1.1.21.0.0 **VICTIMS' JUSTICE FUND ACCOUNT** - means an account established under section 5(1) of the *Bill of Rights 1995*.
- 1.1.22.0.0 **VICTIMS' JUSTICE FUND** – means a set fee based on the amount of the Administrative Penalty applicable to Contraventions of this By-law.

2.0.0.0.0 **GENERAL PROVISIONS**

2.1.0.0.0 **CONTRAVENTION OF POSTED SPEED LIMITS**

2.1.1.0.0 Every Owner of a motor vehicle found in Contravention of a posted speed limit in a Community Safety or School Zone by use of an Automated Speed Enforcement camera system shall be subject to a Penalty Order as authorized by Section 21.1 and section 207 of the *Highway Traffic Act*.

2.1.2.0.0 The *Provincial Offences Act* does not apply if a Penalty Order is issued through an Administrative Penalty System.

2.1.3.0.0 Despite any other provision of the City of Barrie Fees By-law, Schedule "A" of this By-law sets out the applicable Administrative Fees imposed for the purposes of this By-law including the Victims' Justice Fund component.

2.1.4.0.0 Schedule "B" of this By-law sets out the applicable Administrative Penalty associated with the stated Contravention.

2.1.5.0.0 If a Penalty Order becomes due and payable on a Holiday, the next business day will be deemed to be the due date.

2.2.0.0.0 **APPLICATION OF THIS BY-LAW**

2.2.1.0.0 The City shall have a sole Contractor to supply Automated Speed Enforcement camera systems, maintenance and repair which shall comply with all requirements of Ontario Regulation 398/19 of the *Highway Traffic Act*.

2.2.2.0.0 Photograph evidence along with all the required data outlined in Ontario Regulation 398/19 shall be provided by the Contractor to an Officer for purposes of investigating Contraventions of the maximum posted speed limits in Community Safety or School Zones.

2.2.3.0.0 Once the Officer has reasonable and probable grounds to believe a Contravention has occurred, the Officer shall request the Owner information for the vehicle plate in question from the Ministry of Transportation.

2.2.4.0.0 Once the ownership information is received, the Officer shall issue a Penalty Order to the Owner for the specified Contravention including all applicable fees.

2.2.5.0.0 The Penalty Order shall include the following: a unique file number, the provision contravened, the date and location of the Contravention, an identification of the motor vehicle that was involved in the Contravention, the amount of the Administrative Penalty determined under schedule "B" to this By-law, a statement that the Owner of the motor vehicle may, no later than 30 days after the day the order is served on them, commence an appeal, information regarding the appeal process including the manner in which to commence an appeal, a copy of the photograph or image of the motor vehicle involved in the Contravention, statements by the authorized Persons that are certified to be true in respect of the Contravention and in respect of the service of the Penalty Order.

2.2.6.0.0 The total amount of the Penalty Order shall include the appropriate penalty as per Schedule "B" to this By-law, the applicable Victim's Justice Fund Amount and any other applicable fees as per schedule "A" to this By-law.

2.2.7.0.0 The Penalty Order must be completed and mailed to the offender within 23 days from the Contravention date.

2.2.8.0.0 The Penalty Notice is due and payable within 30 days of the date the Penalty Order is received or from the Effective Date of Service unless the matter has been appealed.

2.3.0.0.0 **APPEAL TO A SCREENING OFFICER**

2.3.1.0.0 The City Clerk shall delegate the duties of a Screening Officer to employees of the City of Barrie on an as required basis. Screening Officers and Hearing Officers shall not be one in the same as described under this By-law.

2.3.2.0.0 An appeal of a Penalty Order shall be commenced within 30 days after the date on which service of the order or the Effective Date of Service.

2.3.3.0.0 A Person who is subject to a Penalty Order may commence the first stage appeal by requesting, in the manner set out in the order, a review of the Penalty Order by a Screening Officer.

- 2.3.4.0.0 The first stage of an appeal to a Screening Officer shall be completed by electronic means, The Screening Officer must take into consideration accommodation concerns and may make alternative arrangements such as completing the review in writing or orally over the phone, if required.
- 2.3.5.0.0 If a date and time is set for an appellant to make submissions in respect of any stage of an appeal, the appellant shall attend at the set date and time.
- 2.3.6.0.0 The Screening Officer may confirm, vary, or set aside the Penalty Order and shall do so as soon as practical after the review is complete.
- 2.3.6.1.0 A Screening Officer shall only set aside a Penalty Order under the following circumstances:
- The Penalty Order is incomplete;
 - The Penalty Order was not issued by an authorized Person;
 - There is no information regarding how and when to commence an appeal with the Penalty Order;
 - No corresponding information or evidence has been received from the processing centre (i.e. images, enlargement of the plate, MTO proof of ownership, and the certified statement of the Officer)
 - The image or images are not clear; do not set out the proper data; or the plate and jurisdiction can't be clearly read.
 - Information on the image does not match the information set out in the corresponding certified statement;
 - The location of the Contravention is not an identified Community Safety or School Zone;
 - The make and model of the ASE system is not indicated in the certified statement;
 - The speed of the motor vehicle at the time of the Contravention is not indicated in the Penalty Order;
 - The posted speed limit is not stated in the Penalty Order;
 - There is no marker in the image provided with the certified statement or the marker does not touch the motor vehicle;
 - There is no date included in the certified statement, for the certificate of accuracy or the date stated is outside the time allowed;
 - There is no indication in the certified statement or that the signage, required by section 8 of the Regulation, was posted;
 - The Person has credible and reliable evidence that the Person was not the Owner of the vehicle in question at the time of the Contravention;
 - The Person has proof the vehicle and/or vehicle plate in question was lost or stolen at the time of the Contravention;
 - Where the vehicle in question was an emergency vehicle and falls within the exemptions outlined in section 128 (13) of the Highway Traffic Act;
 - Financial Hardship.
- 2.3.6.2.0 A Screening Officer shall only vary the amount of the Penalty Order upon receiving credible evidence that the Person is subject to financial hardship. The Screening Officer must weigh and justify the reasons for a variation. If the reasons provided are so strong to justify a variation, the Screening Officer should set aside a Penalty Order to ensure the integrity of the program.
- 2.3.6.3.0 The Screening Officer may order periodic payments should the Owner establish their inability to pay the Penalty Order within the prescribed time frame. The Owner must fully set out in the prescribed form the reasons they are seeking an extension of time to pay their penalty(ies) and provide supporting documentation as to their current financial circumstances to establish a fair and reasonable payment plan.
- 2.3.6.3.1 Under no circumstances shall a request for an extension to the time to pay be accepted after 15 days after the expiry of the appeal period.
- 2.3.6.3.2 Supporting documentation includes but is not limited to the following:
- a copy of the Canada Revenue Agency Notice of Tax Assessment for the last full calendar year;
 - proof of receipt of any income supplement and the amount of such supplement including Old Age Security, pension information (CPP, disability or other pensions), Ontario Student Assistance Program, and any child or spousal support orders.
- 2.3.6.3.3 A copy of the approved payment plan shall be given to the Owner setting out a first lump sum payment with a due date as well as the dates and amounts of the following periodic payments.

- 2.3.6.3.4 Failure to make the first lump sum payment by the due date will result in deeming the Owner in default. Failure to make two consecutive payments by the due dates will also result in deeming the Owner in default.
- 2.3.6.3.5 If the Owner is deemed to be in default status, the remaining penalty amount and any applicable fees will be submitted to the Defaulted Fines Control Centre which will result in the Owner having to pay the entire outstanding amount to renew their existing vehicle plates or to request a new vehicle plate.
- 2.3.6.3.6 No further payment plans will be considered for a Penalty Order once the Owner allows it to fall into a default status.
- 2.3.6.3.7 The Screening Officer shall make the first lump sum payment equivalent to the Victims Justice Fund Account amount plus up to 15% of the penalty amount for Penalty Orders totalling \$750.00 or less, and at least a total of \$250.00 where the total Penalty Order amount is greater than \$750.00.
- 2.3.6.3.8 The Screening Officer shall consider the following time periods when determining a fair and reasonable payment plan.

| Amount Owing | Extension Period to Pay |
|------------------|-------------------------|
| \$50-250 | 2 months |
| \$251-500 | 3 months |
| \$501-750 | 4 months |
| \$750-1,000 | 6 months |
| \$1,001-1,799 | 12 months |
| \$1,800 and over | 24 months |

- 2.3.6.4.0 If a Screening Officer considers it fair and appropriate in the circumstances, the Officer may extend the 30-day period to commence an appeal and the extension may be made even after the 30-day period has expired.
- 2.3.6.4.1 The granting of an appeal extension is discretionary and must be exercised reasonably and fairly. The applicant must establish extenuating circumstances that through no fault of their own lead to their failure to meet a time limit.
- 2.3.6.4.2 Where the extension application is made within the 30-day appeal period, any extension granted shall not exceed 30 days past the end of the appeal period. If an extension is denied within the appeal period, the applicant must submit their hearing request within the appeal period.
- 2.3.6.4.3 Where the extension application is made after the 30-day appeal period expires the application must be made within 30 days of the expiry date of the appeal period. If an extension is denied after the appeal period has expired, the Penalty Order is deemed confirmed and the Administrative Penalty is due forthwith and no later than 7 days from the date of the decision to deny the extension.
- 2.3.6.4.4 The Screening Officer shall send a copy of the decision to the appellant by mail, courier, or electronic means as soon as practical after the decision is made.
- 2.3.6.4.5 All decisions of the Screening Officer are final unless there is a second stage appeal launched by the applicant within 30 days of the date of the decision of the Screening Officer.
- 2.4.0.0.0 **APPEAL TO A HEARING OFFICER**
- 2.4.1.0.0 An appellant may commence the second stage of an appeal by requesting a review of the Screening Officer's decision by a Hearing Officer within 30 days of the date of the decision of the Screening Officer.
- 2.4.2.0.0 The Hearing Officer may confirm, vary, or set aside the decision of the Screening Officer and shall do so as soon as practical after the review is complete.
- 2.4.3.0.0 The Hearing Officer shall determine whether the stage of appeal for which they are responsible is to be conducted orally, electronically or in writing and shall ensure that the appellant is informed of the determination.
- 2.4.4.0.0 If a date and time is set for an appellant to make submissions in respect of any stage of an appeal, the appellant shall attend at the set date and time.
- 2.4.5.0.0 A Hearing Officer shall not decide whether to confirm, vary or set aside a Penalty Order unless the appellant has been given an opportunity to make submissions in the same manner in which the appeal is to be conducted.

2.4.6.0.0 A Hearing Officer shall not decide whether to confirm, vary or set aside a Penalty Order unless a representative of the municipality in which the Contravention that is the subject of a Penalty Order occurred has been given an opportunity to make submissions in the same manner in which the appeal is to be conducted.

2.4.7.0.0 No witnesses shall be called in an appeal.

2.4.8.0.0 The Hearing Officer shall send a copy of the decision to the appellant by mail, courier or electronic means as soon as practical after the decision is made.

2.5.0.0.0 **DETERMINATION OF AN APPEAL**

2.5.1.0.0 In deciding whether to confirm, vary or set aside a Penalty Order, a Screening Officer shall determine whether it was reasonable for the authorized Person to impose the Penalty Order.

2.5.2.0.0 In deciding whether to confirm, vary or set aside a Penalty Order, a Hearing Officer shall determine whether the decision of the Screening Officer was reasonable.

2.5.3.0.0 In making a determination mentioned in 2.5.1.0.0 or 2.5.2.0.0, the Screening Officer or Hearing Officer, as the case may be, may consider the following information, if available:

1. Photographs or images taken by the camera system or enforcement system, as applicable.
2. Statements, including certified statements, made by the authorized Person who imposed the Penalty Order.
3. Documents, including certified documents, setting out the name and address of the Person who is subject to the order, a description of the permit and the number plate of the motor vehicle.
4. Statements by the appellant made either in writing or in the manner in which the appeal is conducted.
5. Statements by or on behalf of the municipality in which the Contravention that is the subject of the Penalty Order occurred, made either in writing or in the manner in which the appeal is conducted.
6. Any other information, materials or submissions that the Screening Officer or Hearing Officer considers to be credible or trustworthy in the circumstances.

2.6.0.0.0 **DECISIONS**

2.6.1.0.0 A Screening Officer or Hearing Officer does not have jurisdiction to consider questions relating to the validity of a statute, regulation or by-law or the constitutional applicability or operability of any statute, regulation or by-law.

2.6.2.0.0 If a Screening Officer or Hearing Officer decides to vary the amount of an Administrative Penalty, they shall vary the amount in accordance with the following rules:

- a. If the total amount of a penalty is decreased, the amount to be credited to the Victims' Justice Fund Account is reduced proportionally to the decrease in the total penalty amount.
- b. If the appellant failed to attend any stage of an appeal, the amount of the penalty shall be increased by \$60.
- c. For greater certainty, an increase made under paragraph b above does not affect the amount payable to the Victims' Justice Fund Account.
- d. The amount of the penalty shall not be increased other than in accordance with paragraph "b" above.

2.6.3.0.0 The decision of a Hearing Officer is final.

3.0.0.0.0 **PAYMENT AND FEES**

3.1.0.0.0 **COLLECTION OF PAYMENT**

3.1.1.0.0 The total penalty amount is payable to the City of Barrie

3.2.0.0.0 **PAYMENT – NO APPEAL**

3.2.1.0.0 The Person subject to the Penalty Order shall pay the Administrative Penalty within 30 days after the date on which service of the order is deemed to have been effected, unless an appeal has been commenced.

3.3.0.0.0 **PAYMENT – POST APPEAL**

3.3.1.0.0 If an appeal of a Penalty Order does not result in the Penalty Order being set aside, the Person who is subject to the order shall pay the Administrative Penalty within 30 days after:

a) the date of the decision of the Screening Officer, if no request for a review of the decision was made; or

b) the date of the decision by the Hearing Officer, if a request was made within 30 days of the decision of the Screening Officer.

3.4.0.0.0 **EXTENSION OF PAYMENT DEADLINE – PLAN OF PERIODIC PAYMENTS**

3.4.1.0.0 If a Screening Officer or Hearing Officer considers it fair and appropriate in the circumstances, the Person may be approved to make periodic payments that extends beyond the 30-day deadline.

3.4.2.0.0 An approval of a plan for a Person to make periodic payments may be conditional on the payment of a specified amount of the Administrative Penalty being made on or before a specified date.

3.4.3.0.0 A plan of periodic payments may be approved even after the 30-day period for payment has expired.

3.5.0.0.0 **VICTIMS' JUSTICE FUND ACCOUNT**

3.5.1.0.0 When an Administrative Penalty is paid, the City of Barrie shall arrange for the proper surcharge amount determined by Schedule "A" in accordance with Regulation 355/22 of the Highway Traffic Act which may be changed from time to time, to this By-law, to be credited to the Victims' Justice Fund Account.

3.5.2.0.0 The City of Barrie shall arrange for the surcharge amount to be credited to the Victims' Justice Fund Account before retaining any portion of the payment.

3.6.0.0.0 **SETTING ASIDE THE PENALTY ORDER UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES**

3.6.1.0.0 If, before a final decision is made in respect of an appeal, a Screening Officer or Hearing Officer, as the case may be, becomes aware that, contrary to subsection 21.1 (4) of the *Highway Traffic Act*, the Person who is subject to the Penalty Order is charged with an offence under the *Act* in respect of the same Contravention, the officer shall set aside the Penalty Order.

4.0.0.0.0 **ENFORCEMENT**

4.1.0.0.0 **CONSEQUENCES FOR FAILURE TO PAY ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY**

4.1.2.0.0 If an Administrative Penalty is not paid within the 30-day period, as applicable, or in accordance with a plan of periodic payments approved by the screening or Hearing Officer, the municipality in which the Contravention that is the subject of the Penalty Order occurred may notify the Ministry.

4.1.3.0.0 If a municipality notifies the Ministry under 4.1.2.0.0 in respect of a Penalty Order,

(a) the municipality shall not collect payment of the Administrative Penalty and instead the Ministry shall collect payment;

(b) the Person who is subject to the Penalty Order shall pay a Late Payment Fee of \$20 and the amount of the Late Payment Fee shall be included in the amount of the Administrative Penalty for enforcement purposes; and

(c) issuance and validation of a permit may be refused to the Owner of a motor vehicle who is subject to the Penalty Order until the penalty is paid.

5.0.0.0.0 ENACTMENT

5.1.0.0.0 That this By-law shall come into force and effect upon the day of passing thereof

READ a first and second time this 14th day of August 2024.

READ a third time and finally passed this 14th day of August 2024.
