SERVICE BARRIE

Service Barrie is open for in-person services (no appointments needed) from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday (excluding holidays). Face masks are required.

Appointments are still required for obtaining marriage licenses and commissioning of business licenses. As well, Planning and Building staff are available in person at City Hall for inquiries during regular business hours.

LANDFILL

More vehicles are allowed at the landfill, but residents are reminded to wear a mask and maintain physical distancing. Composters and garbage bag tags are now for sale again, and cash is accepted again as a payment form.

RECREATION/COMMUNITY CENTRES & SPORTS FIELDS

Recreation facilities opened for in-person visits the morning of July 23. Registration is required for all activities via play.barrie.ca.

All visitors to our recreation facilities must complete the online screening form the day of your activity and bring the email confirmation for entry. The screening form and more information is available at barrie.ca/RecUpdates.

PATIOS

Patio hours of operation have reverted back to the original hours permitted under City By-laws and the Patios Everywhere Program:

- A person can enter or re-enter a patio up until 10:30 p.m., Monday to Sunday.
- Patios can remain open until 11:15 p.m., Monday to Sunday.

COMMUNITY BBQS

Community BBQs at Centennial Park and Tyndale Park are now open. City staff will unlock the BBQs and empty the coals at the beginning of each day and periodically as needed. Please clean grills and grilling area before and after use.
