- Step 1:** Large outdoor gatherings for up to 10 people; Outdoor dining for up to 4 people per table; Essential retail capacity at 25%; Non-essential retail at 15%; Outdoor religious services and ceremonies with capacity limited to permit 2 metres physical distancing; Outdoor sports, training, and personal training for up to 10 people; Day camps, campsites & campgrounds; Ontario Parks; Outdoor pools, splash pads & wading pools.
- Step 2:** Large outdoor gatherings for up to 25 people; Small indoor gatherings for up to 5 people; Outdoor dining for up to 6 people per table; Essential retail capacity at 50%; Personal care services where face coverings can be worn at all times; Outdoor meeting & event spaces, amusement & water parks, boat tour operators; Outdoor county fairs & rural exhibitions; Outdoor sports leagues & events; Outdoor cinemas, performing arts, live music events and attractions.
- Step 3:** Large indoor & outdoor gatherings; Indoor dining; Essential & non-essential retail open with limited capacity; Larger indoor religious services, rites & ceremony gatherings; Indoor meetings & event spaces; Indoor sports & recreational facilities; Indoor seated events; Indoor attractions and cultural amenities; Other outdoor activities from Step 2 permitted to operate indoors.

Update to City Services During STEP 1

SERVICE BARRIE: The City's customer service centre, Service Barrie, is open for in-person appointments. Visit barrie.ca/contact for more information on how to make an appointment or call 705-726-4242 to book an appointment.

Final Tax Payments Due June 30 and September 30

Final tax bills have been mailed out, and payments are due on June 30 and September 30. All payments must be received by the City on or before the due date to avoid late payment fees of 1.25% per month. If your taxes are paid by a mortgage company, you will still receive a notice, please send to your mortgage company and retain a copy for your records.

DAY CAMPS: Outdoor summer day camps will start on July 5 for children ages 6 to 12. Due to the pandemic, City camps have introduced several new safety procedures. Campers will spend the entire day outdoors unless there is inclement weather. Register at play.barrie.ca.

In April 2021, City Council waived late payment fees for property tax payments until September 30, 2021. The City will continue to charge late fees on accounts with outstanding balances from 2020 and prior. If "Tax Arrears" appears on your bill, it means that at the time of billing, there was an outstanding balance on your account.

LANDFILL: The landfill remains open with a reduced capacity (10 vehicles at a time). Residents are required to wear a mask and maintain physical distance from others. Recycling boxes and green bins will be given out at the Recycling Depot ONLY.

Canada Day Holiday Notice

On **Canada Day (Thursday, July 1)**, the following City service changes will be in effect:

Barrie Transit: Will run according to the regular Sunday service schedule.

Curbside Collection: No garbage, organics, recycling or yard waste collection on July 1. Collection will occur ONE day later throughout the rest of the week:

Thursday, July 1 → Friday, July 2
Friday, July 2 → Saturday, July 3

The landfill is closed July 1 and reopens on July 2.

Yard waste is collected every other week opposite your garbage collection week in July and August.

DID YOU KNOW?

Thinking of having a backyard fire?

You will need a burn permit first. Outdoor burning must be done in an approved appliance, 8 a.m. to midnight only, and not during high winds or a fire ban.

Permits are available via barrie.ca/BurnPermits for \$22. Permits are issued per calendar year.

Those without a permit will be fined for burning without a permit. A second complaint for the same address within a 24-hour period, regardless of whether there is a permit, can result in a fine of \$305.
