

Early Life Pavement Preservation Pilot Program

The City of Barrie has retained the services of Superior Road Products for the implementation of the Early Life Pavement Preservation Pilot Program, specifically the application of Reclamite treatment to road surfaces in select neighbourhoods (see project extents below). The work will include the contractor applying the product to the road surface in liquid form and covering it with a thin layer of limestone screenings or sand to protect vehicles as the product sets. The project is expected to begin on September 24, 2018 for product application, and end with street sweeping and site restoration on September 28, 2018.

What Is Reclamite?

Reclamite is an environmentally friendly asphalt rejuvenator used to extend the service life of paved road surfaces early in the asphalt's service life (roads with minor cracking – non-structural cracking).

Why Is This Work Being Undertaken?

This project is being conducted to preserve the asphalt surface of the roadways while extending their service life. As a result of this pilot project, the City anticipates being able to reduce roadway maintenance costs and prevent expensive roadway resurfacing construction. This allows the City to allocate funding to other needs throughout the City while minimizing disruption to residents and providing desired service levels.

Will My Services Be Affected?

Your sanitary and water services, hydro, telephone, cable TV, and gas services should not be affected by the construction, barring any unforeseen circumstance. However, the application process will leave the treated asphalt with a "stained" appearance, this is strictly cosmetic and temporary. The asphalt will fade back to its initial colour within 4 to 6 weeks. Furthermore, as noted above, the treated asphalt will be covered with loose limestone screenings or sand immediately after the application of Reclamite. This will only stay in place for one day and should be fully swept and cleaned from the treated roadways. **We ask that residents refrain from parking on the road on Monday September 24, 2018 to Friday September 28 until the sweeping is complete (between the hours of 7:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.).**

Access To Properties

Vehicle access to properties within the construction limits will be provided at almost all times during construction periods. On several occasions, however, direct access to driveways will be interrupted, for a short duration, as the application material sets. Pedestrian access will be maintained during construction. At no point should construction vehicles enter your driveway. Please notify Scott Fraser if this occurs (see below).

Special Needs

If you have any special needs, or if wheelchair access is required, please advise Michael Brown, Infrastructure Program Engineer (see below).

Please contact Scott Fraser or Michael Brown if you operate a business, planning an event, etc. that will require parking along the roadway and are concerned how the construction process may affect your situation. The City of Barrie and Superior Roads Products will strive to minimize disruptions during the Reclamite application.

Emergency Services

Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

Garbage Collection

On the normal collection day, place all garbage/organics/recyclable and yard waste materials at the front of your property by 7:00 a.m. The proposed construction work should not affect the truck's access to your garbage or recycling containers. Please ensure that the containers are located on the boulevard and not on the road.

Safety

The contractor is required to conduct their work in a safe manner, including traffic control, etc. We ask that you take extra caution during the construction period to ensure everyone's safety.
