### Pavement Preservation – Micro-surfacing– Pilot Program

The City of Barrie has awarded Contract 2018-109T to Duncor Enterprises Inc. for the implementation of the Early Life Pavement Preservation Pilot Program, specifically micro-surfacing road surfaces in select neighbourhoods (see listed streets below). The work includes minor asphalt base repairs and micro-surfacing of fifteen (15) residential streets within the City of Barrie including minor restorations.

The work includes the following streets:

- Benson Drive;
- Hodgson Drive;
- Deerpark Drive;
- Cardinal Street;
- Rolston Drive;
- Baltimore Road;
- Bluejay Drive;
- Chestnut Court;
- Rosedale Place;
- Aspen Drive;
- Ashdale Court;
- Hazel Avenue;
- Woodgrove Court;
- Parkway Place; and,
- Springdale Drive (Aspen to Maplehurst).

Construction is expected to start September 24, 2018. All works are scheduled to be completed by October 5, 2018, weather permitting.

### Why Is This Work Being Undertaken?

Microsurfacing is the addition of a thin pavement layer aimed at extending the life of existing pavements. Microsurfacing is less costly than asphalt resurfacing and is less disruptive.

The project has been included in the 2018 Capital budget.

### Access to Properties

Lane closures will occur during construction.

Please refrain from parking on the street during the work.

*Please check the City's [Road Ahead / 2018 Asphalt Resurfacing](#) webpage for the most current dates for when your street will be surfaced and parking restrictions.*

Vehicle access to properties within the construction limits will be provided at almost all times during construction periods. However, there may be some temporary interruptions to access during construction. Access will be restored as quickly as possible.

The Contractor must give prior notice of any imminent access restrictions to the businesses and/or residents.

During the construction, some short delays (e.g. a few minutes) while driving through the construction area can be expected while equipment is maneuvering, trucks are dumping, etc. We ask for your patience in such instances.

Pedestrian access will be maintained during construction.

### Accessibility Needs

If you have any accessibility needs, or if wheelchair access is required, please advise the contacts listed.

### Emergency Services

Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

### Safety

The Contractor is required to conduct his work in a safe manner, including fencing of deep excavations, etc. We ask that you take extra caution during the construction period to ensure everyone's safety.

### Garbage Collection

On the normal collection day, place all garbage/organics/recyclable and yardwaste materials at the front of your property by 7:00 a.m.

The construction contractor will remove these items and take them outside the construction zone, for pick up by the collection contractor. Emptied containers will be returned to the appropriate driveway. Please mark your address on all of your containers, with a black marker.
