

Brock Park Neighbourhood Reconstruction – Phase 1

Start Date: Ongoing
End Date: August 2024
**Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Barrie (City) is continuing work for the Brock Park Neighbourhood Reconstruction Project, and has awarded the contract to North Rock Group Limited (North Rock). Phase 1 work completed in 2023 includes: all underground infrastructure work, new curb installation, new roadway asphalt, a new sidewalk on Innisfil Street and, temporary restorations to disturbed driveways and yards. Continuation of this phase is anticipated to start in late March 2024.

This work is part of City Council’s approved 2022 budget and aligns with the infrastructure investments to update and improve infrastructure from their strategic direction.

WORK DETAILS

North Rock will:

- Construct a cul-de-sac at the end of Frederick Street
- Install and replace sidewalks on John Street, Frederick Street, and Robert Street
- Install streetlights throughout project streets
- Restore disturbed driveways
- Replace topsoil and sod to disturbed City boulevards and,
- Apply final layer of roadway asphalt

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience inconveniences such as dust, noise, and short delays. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts, and your patience is appreciated.

	Road and Sidewalk Access: Pedestrian access will be maintained during construction. Innisfil Street will experience short term lane closures, but will remain open to through traffic. John Street, Frederick Street, and Robert Street, will be closed to through traffic, with access to residences and businesses being maintained or redirected. The City will post signage, as required, with traffic redirection instructions.
	Driveway Access: Vehicle entry to properties within the construction limits will be available. At times, direct access to driveways will be interrupted for watermain, sanitary sewer, and storm sewer work.

	Access for emergency vehicles will always be maintained. Services: Hydro, water, telephone, cable TV, and gas services should not be affected by the construction, barring any unforeseen circumstances.
	Accessibility: If you have any accessibility requirements, or if wheelchair access is required, please contact the City representatives listed below.
	Traffic Management: The Contractor will use traffic control measures, such as traffic cones, to steer through traffic around contractor equipment and vehicles within the construction site. Flag persons will assist with traffic control, if required.
	Transit Service: The proposed construction will affect Barrie transit routes, and schedules. Changes to bus routes in the construction area will be posted in advance.
	Parking: Parking on roadways in an active construction area is not permitted. Vehicles parked in the construction area will be ticketed and towed.
	Garbage and Recycling: Garbage, recycling, and yard waste will be collected on the regular collection day during construction. Ensure everything for pick up is curbside by 7:00 a.m. on the collection day. Please mark your collection bins with your address, should temporary relocation of the collection bins be necessary by the Contractor.
	Safety: The Contractor is required to conduct work in a safe manner, such as using traffic cones and fencing off excavations. Please use extra caution in the construction zone to ensure everyone's safety.
