# **Notice of Study Commencement: 2051 Transportation Master Plan**

Laying the Foundation for Tomorrow's Infrastructure

### **The Study**

The 2019 provincial Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe has identified that the City of Barrie will grow to 298,000 people and 150,000 jobs by 2051. The City of Barrie (the "City") is updating its Transportation Master Plan (TMP) to determine multi-modal infrastructure requirements to support this growth. The study area encompasses the entire City boundary, shown on the map.

The TMP will have a broad scope and level of assessment. The analysis will be on a systems scale to identify infrastructure needs and establish broader alternatives and solutions. The TMP will form the basis for future, more detailed investigations for projects generated that are subject to the Environmental Assessment Act.


#### The Process

This TMP is being undertaken to address Phases 1 and 2 of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment process following Master Planning Process, Approach #1.

WSP Canada has been retained by the City to complete the TMP. The study duration is approximately two years.
