

## EUGENIA STREET & WELLINGTON D1 NEIGHBOURHOOD RECONSTRUCTION

**START DATE: AUGUST 2024**


**END DATE: AUGUST 2026**

The City of Barrie (City) is beginning work on the Eugenia Street and Wellington D1 Neighbourhood Reconstruction Project and have awarded the contract to North Rock Group Limited (The Contractor).

This work is part of City Council's approved Capital Budget and aligns with the 2022-2026 Strategic Plan for Infrastructure Investments.

### WORK SCHEDULE

#### Summer Through Fall 2024

- Overhanging tree branch removal from trees on the boulevards on Project streets
- Eugenia Street (From Berczy Street to Dundonald Street), Albert Street, and Dundonald Street
- Eugenia Street (Dundonald Street to St. Vincent Street) with uncompleted works starting in Spring 2025

#### Spring Through Fall 2025

- Eugenia Street (Dundonald Street to St. Vincent Street) continuation of works started in Fall 2024
- Berczy Street (Collier Street to Poyntz Street); Worsley Street (Poyntz Street to Berczy Street); Amelia Street (Berczy Street to end of roadway and Albert Street to 50 metres Easterly); Theresa Street and, Albert Street.

#### Summer 2026

All roadways listed above to have warranty repairs completed, and top layer of asphalt placed.

### WORK DETAILS

The Contractor will:










- Upgrade and expand storm and sanitary sewers, including sanity services from roadway to property line,
- Replace watermain and water services from roadway to property line,
- Restore and replace roadways, curbs, sidewalks, and boulevards,
- Reinstate impacted driveways, and;
- Prune low hanging tree branches to facilitate construction activities.

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience inconveniences such as, dust, noise, and short delays. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts, and your patience is appreciated.

Further notice will be provided to property owners who are required to remove items such as, decorative objects located within City property limits (boulevard).

If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard portion of your property, please contact the City representatives identified below. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property, including sprinkler system.

	The Contractor has retained the services of OZA Inspections Limited to complete a precondition survey of the interior and exterior of your home. Separate letters will be sent from the City and the survey company to book an appointment.
	<p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b></p> <p>Pedestrian access will be maintained during construction.</p> <p>The Contractor will close active construction areas to through traffic with access to residences being maintained. The City will post signage, as required, for detour routes.</p> <p>Access for emergency vehicles will always be maintained.</p>
	<p><b>Driveway Access:</b></p> <p>At times, direct access to driveways will be interrupted. This interruption is anticipated to be short term, less than one (1) working day and advance notice will be provided to affected residences informing them of anticipated interruptions.</p> <p><b>Services:</b></p> <p>Hydro, telephone, cable TV, and gas services should not be affected by the construction, barring any unforeseen circumstances.</p> <p>Water and sanitary sewer services will be interrupted for a short period of time. Advance notice of the service interruptions will be provided.</p>
	<p><b>Accessibility:</b></p> <p>If you have any accessibility requirements, such as wheelchair access, home care, or regular home meal deliveries, please contact the City representatives listed below.</p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b></p> <p>The Contractor will use traffic control measures, such as traffic cones to steer traffic around contractor equipment and vehicles, within the construction site. Flag persons will assist with traffic control, if required.</p>
	<p><b>Transit Service:</b></p> <p>The proposed construction will affect Barrie Transit routes, and schedules. Changes to bus routes in the construction area will be posted in advance.</p>
	<p><b>Parking:</b></p> <p>Parking on roadways in an active construction area is not permitted. Vehicles parked in the construction zone will be ticketed and towed.</p>
	<p><b>Garbage and Recycling:</b></p> <p>Garbage, recycling, and yard waste will be collected on the regular collection day during construction. The Contractor may need to move items to a designated area for pickup by the City's waste contractor. Garbage cans, organics bins, and recycling boxes will be returned to your property later the same day. <b>Clearly mark your address on all containers.</b></p> <p>Ensure everything for pick up is curbside by <b>7:00 a.m. on the collection day or it may not be picked up.</b></p>
	<p><b>Safety:</b></p> <p>The Contractor is required to conduct work in a safe manner, such as using traffic cones and fencing off excavations. Please use extra caution in the construction zone to ensure everyone's safety.</p>
