



North Shore Trail





Trail At A Glance

March 2009

Distance: 3km Difficulty: Easy Surface: Stonedust Terrain: Level Width: 3.5 metres

Suitability: Bicycling, Walking, Strollers, Snowshoeing, Cross County Skiing

Seasonal Use: Not maintained during winter months

Parking: Heritage Park, Johnson Beach, on-street

Washrooms: Johnsons Beach (summer), Heritage Park (May-October)

Amenities; Johnson Beach, Spray Pad in Heritage Park

Refreshments: Restaurants in Downtown Barrie

Hours of Operation: 5am - 10pm

Trail Features: View from Johnsons Beach Bridge over beach and bay.

Trail Hazards: Poison Ivy occurring along trail edges, steep vegetated side slopes along Kempenfelt Bay - please stay on trail. Multi-use trail means both pedestrians and cyclists are using the trail. Trail is not lit after dark.

Trail Rules (see By-law 88-260-4): Motorized vehicles are prohibited on the trail, such as snowmobiles and ATVs. Dogs must be leashed. Damage to or removal of vegetation is prohibited.

Other Local Trails: Waterfront Trail, Nine Mile Portage Heritage Trail, Trans Canada Trail, Lake Country Oro-Medonte Rail Trail.
