End Date: August 2026



The City of Barrie (City) is continuing work for the Eugenia Street and Wellington D1 Neighbourhood Reconstruction project. The project was awarded to North Rock Group Limited (North Rock). The continuation of work completed in 2024 on Eugenia Street between Dundonald and St. Vincent is anticipated to resume in February 2025.

CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE

AREA	TIMELINE	DESCRIPTION
Eugenia Street (Berczy Street to Dundonald Street) including Albert Street and Dundonald Street (Eugenia Street to Codrington Street)	2024	Complete underground infrastructure installations, curb, sidewalk, boulevard restorations and driveway paving.
	Spring/Summer 2025	Sidewalk installations and boulevard restorations on Albert Street and Dundonald Street.
Berczy Street, Amelia Street, and Theresa Street	Winter/Spring 2025	Alectra, Bell and Rogers utility relocations.
Eugenia Street (Dundonald Street to St. Vincent Street)	Winter/Spring 2025	Complete underground infrastructure installations. Weather permitting complete curb, sidewalk, boulevard restorations and driveway paving. If weather is unfavourable, temporary asphalt may be utilized on the roadway.
Berczy Street (Collier Street to Poyntz Street); Worsley Street (Poyntz Street to Berczy Street); Amelia Street (Berczy Street to End); Theresa Street (Berczy Street to Dundonald Street); Albert Street (Theresa Street to Eugenia Street); and Amelia Street (Albert Street to Dundonald Street)	Spring/Summer/Fall 2025	Complete underground infrastructure installations, curb, sidewalk, boulevard restorations, and driveway paving.
All roads within project	Summer 2026	Top course asphalt and warranty repairs.

WORK DETAILS

North Rock Group will renew the life of the deteriorating roadway and underground infrastructure in the area, as well as increase the drinking water network capacity. The storm and sanitary sewer networks will expand and be upgraded to meet current City standards.






Project Highlights:




- Road reconstruction including new curbs, sidewalks, and asphalt,
- Watermain replacement and upgrades including the service replacement from the watermain to the property line,
- Sanitary sewer replacement including new services from the main to property line,
- Storm sewer replacement and improvements, and
- Streetlight replacement.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience inconveniences such as dust, noise, and short delays. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts, and your patience is appreciated.

Further notice will be provided to property owners who are required to remove items, such as decorative objects, located within City property limits (boulevard).

	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access:</p> <p>Pedestrian access will be maintained during construction.</p> <p>The Contractor will close areas of active construction to through traffic while they are under construction. The City will post signage, as required, for detour routes.</p> <p>Access for emergency vehicles will always be maintained.</p>
	<p>Driveway Access:</p> <p>Vehicle entry to properties within the construction limits will generally be available.</p> <p>There are some scenarios where driveway access will be limited or unavailable:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • When the contractor is installing new underground infrastructure (sewers or watermain) in front of a driveway. This interruption is anticipated to be short term, less than 1 working day. • During the replacement of concrete curb and concrete sidewalk, advance notice will be provided to affected residents to inform them of the anticipated interruptions. <p>Services:</p> <p>Hydro, telephone, cable TV, and gas services should not be affected by the construction, barring any unforeseen circumstances.</p> <p>Water and Sanitary Sewer Services will be interrupted for a short period of time. Advance notice of the service interruptions will be provided.</p> <p>Irrigation Systems:</p> <p>If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard portion of your property, please contact the City's representatives identified below.</p>
	<p>Accessibility:</p> <p>If you have any accessibility requirements, such as requiring a walker or wheelchair access, please contact the City representatives listed below.</p> <p>We ask that if you receive regular meal deliveries to home or receive in home care, please contact the City representatives listed below.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management:</p> <p>The Contractor will use traffic control measures, such as traffic cones to steer traffic around the contractor's equipment and vehicles, within the construction site. Flag persons will assist with traffic control, if required.</p>
	<p>Transit Service:</p> <p>The proposed construction will affect Barrie Transit routes, and schedules. Changes to bus routes in the construction area will be posted in advance.</p>

	<p>Parking:</p> <p>Parking on roadways in an active construction area is not permitted. Vehicles parked in the construction area will be ticketed and towed.</p>
	<p>Garbage and Recycling:</p> <p>Garbage, recycling, and yard waste will be collected on the regular collection day during construction.</p> <p>North Rock Group may need to move items to a designated area for pickup by the City's waste contractor. Garbage cans, organics bins, and recycling boxes will be returned to your property later the same day. Clearly mark your address on all containers.</p> <p>Ensure everything for pick up is curbside by 7:00 a.m. on the collection day or it may not be picked up.</p>
	<p>Safety:</p> <p>The Contractor is required to conduct work in a safe manner, such as using traffic cones and fencing off excavations. Please use extra caution in the construction zone to ensure everyone's safety.</p>

The City would like to thank all residents for their support and cooperation throughout this project. The City recognizes the impact this work may have on your daily routines and appreciates your understanding and patience throughout the project.
