

MAPLEVIEW DRIVE EAST TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENTS (Yonge Street to Prince William Way)

START DATE: January 2026

END DATE: Spring 2028

Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Barrie (City) is undertaking major transportation upgrades along Mapleview Drive East from Yonge Street to Prince William Way to support planned growth to 2031. The project includes widening the roadway, improving intersections, building multi-use trails, and installing stormwater infrastructure.

This work is part of City Council's approved 2025 budget and aligns with the Infrastructure Investments priority from their strategic direction. This project is funded in part by the Government of Ontario.

The City has awarded the contract to Primrose Contracting (Ontario) Incorporated (Contractor).

WORK DETAILS

The Contractor will:










- Reconstruct and widen Mapleview Drive East (from Yonge Street to Prince William Way) to four (4) through lanes with a centre median.
- Addition of a multi-use trail on the north and south sides
- At-grade crossing of roadway and Metrolinx GO Rail Corridor
- Implementation of storm and sanitary sewers
- New stormwater management pond and low impact development (LID) features
- Remove and replace the existing Hewitt's Creek box culvert
- Upgrade traffic signals at Lily Drive and Kneeshaw Drive, and at the Royal Jubilee intersection
- Improvements to the intersection at Yonge Street
- Improvements to street lighting

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience inconveniences such as, dust, noise, and short delays. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts, and your patience is appreciated.

Further notice will be provided to property owners who are required to remove items such as decorative objects, located within City property limits (boulevard).

If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard portion of your property, please contact the City representatives identified below. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property, including a sprinkler system.

	<p>The Contractor has retained the services of GPM Environmental to complete a precondition survey of the interior and exterior of your home. Separate letters will be sent from the City and the survey company to book an appointment.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access:</p> <p>Any restrictions to road and sidewalk access will be communicated to residences / businesses as required, with information on how access is being redirected. The City will post signage, as required, on how to access businesses.</p> <p>Access for emergency vehicles will always be maintained.</p>
	<p>Driveway Access:</p> <p>Vehicle entry to properties within the construction limits will be available. At times, direct access to driveways will be interrupted for concrete curb and storm sewer work.</p> <p>Services:</p> <p>Hydro, sanitary sewer services, water services, telephone, cable TV, and gas services should not be affected by the construction, barring any unforeseen circumstances.</p>
	<p>Accessibility:</p> <p>If you have any accessibility requirements, such as wheelchair access or home care, please contact the City representatives listed below.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management:</p> <p>The Contractor will use traffic control measures, such as traffic cones to steer through traffic around contractor equipment and vehicles, within the construction site. Flag persons will assist with traffic control, if required.</p>
	<p>Transit Service:</p> <p>The proposed construction will affect Barrie Transit routes, and schedules. Changes to bus routes in the construction area will be posted in advance.</p>
	<p>Parking:</p> <p>Parking on roadways in an active construction area is not permitted. Vehicles parked in the construction zone will be ticketed and towed.</p>
	<p>Garbage and Recycling:</p> <p>Garbage, recycling, and yard waste will be collected on the regular collection day during construction.</p> <p>The Contractor may need to move items to a designated area for pickup by the City's waste contractor. Garbage carts, organics carts, and recycling boxes will be returned to your property later the same day. Clearly mark your address on all containers.</p> <p>Ensure everything for pick up is curbside by 7:00 a.m. on the collection day or it may not be picked up.</p>
	<p>Safety:</p> <p>The Contractor is required to conduct work in a safe manner, such as using traffic cones and fencing off excavations. Please use extra caution in the construction zone to ensure everyone's safety.</p>
