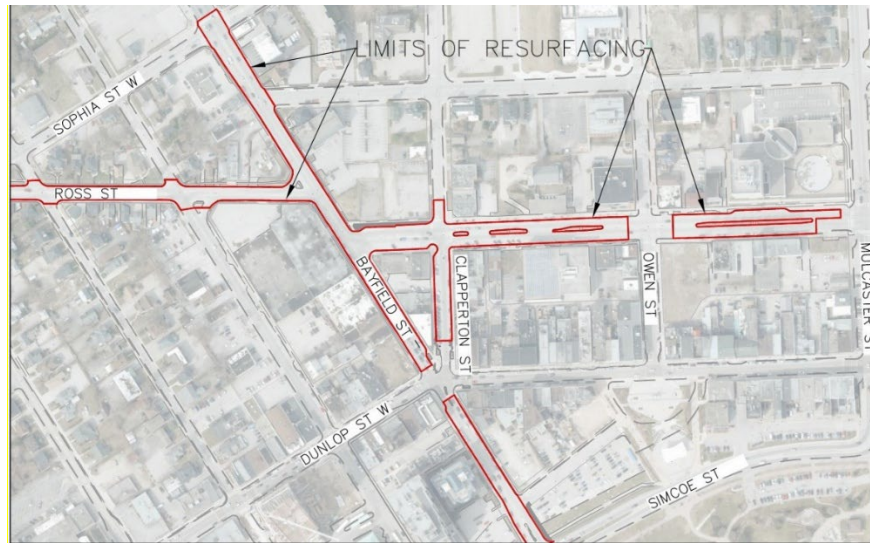

The City of Barrie (City) is resurfacing various downtown streets as part of the 2026 Pavement Management Program. The Contract has not been awarded. Further communication will be issued once the Contractor's schedule has been confirmed.

This work is part of City Council's approved 2026 budget and aligns with Infrastructure Improvements from their strategic direction, which renews aging City Roads, sidewalk and curbs for current and future needs.

MAP OF THE WORK AREA



The City will be resurfacing the following streets in the downtown area:

- Bayfield Street from Sophia Street to Simcoe Street
- Clapperton Street from Dunlop Street to Collier Street
- Collier Street from Bayfield Street to Mulcaster Street
- Ross Street from Sophia Street to Bayfield Street

WORK DETAILS

The work includes:

- Remove interlock brick, concrete curb, and sidewalk, and replace with concrete, as required
- Remove the existing asphalt on the roadway
- Grade existing granular materials
- Place new asphalt on the roadway

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience inconveniences such as, dust, noise, and short delays. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts, and your patience is appreciated.











Road, and Sidewalk Access:

Pedestrian access will be maintained during construction. Access to businesses will be maintained. The Contractor will provide ramping to businesses if any concrete sidewalk occurs in front of a business entrance.

The curb and sidewalk work will take place during the day. The Roads will be open to traffic at all times during the curb and sidewalk work, barring any unforeseen circumstances.

The asphalt removal and replacement of **Bayfield Street, Clapperton Street and Collier Street will be completed at night between the hours of 9:00PM and 7:00AM, and will be closed to through traffic during these hours.** The Contractor will be permitted to set up and take down their traffic control within one (1) hour before and after the permitted closure. The Contractor will post signage as required for detour routes.

	<p>Ross Street will be completed between the hours of 7:00AM and 7:00PM. Ross Street will intermittently have lane closures during active construction, with access to residences being maintained.</p> <p>Access for emergency vehicles will always be maintained.</p>
	<p>Driveway and Business Access:</p> <p>Vehicle entry to properties within the construction limits will be available. At times, direct access during night work and direct access to driveways will be interrupted for concrete and asphalt work.</p> <p>Services:</p> <p>Hydro, sanitary sewer services, water services, telephone, cable TV, and gas services should not be affected by the construction, barring any unforeseen circumstances.</p>
	<p>Patios:</p> <p>Installation of patios within the construction area will be delayed until construction is complete. Please reach out to the City Representative listed below and advise if you plan to install a patio in 2026.</p>
	<p>Accessibility:</p> <p>If you have any accessibility requirements, requirements, such as wheelchair access or home care please contact the City representative listed below.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management:</p> <p>The Contractor will use traffic control measures, such as traffic cones to steer through traffic around contractor equipment and vehicles, within the construction site. Flag persons will assist with traffic control, if required.</p>
	<p>Transit Service:</p> <p>The proposed construction will affect Barrie Transit routes, and schedules. Changes to bus routes in the construction area will be posted in advance.</p>
	<p>Parking:</p> <p>During concrete curb and sidewalk work, localized street parking closures will occur.</p> <p>During asphalt removal and asphalt placement, there will be NO STREET PARKING allowed.</p> <p>Vehicles parked in the construction zone may be ticketed and towed.</p>
	<p>Garbage and Recycling:</p> <p>Garbage, recycling, and yard waste will be collected on the regular collection day during construction. The contractor may need to move items to a designated area for pickup by the City's waste contractor. Garbage cans, organics bins, and recycling boxes will be returned to your property later the same day. Clearly mark your address on all containers.</p> <p>Ensure everything for pick up is curbside by 4:30 a.m. on the collection day or it may not be picked up.</p>
	<p>Safety:</p> <p>The Contractor is required to conduct work in a safe manner, such as using traffic cones and fencing off excavations. Please use extra caution in the construction zone to ensure everyone's safety.</p>
