

CUNDLES NEIGHBOURHOOD RESURFACING PROGRAM

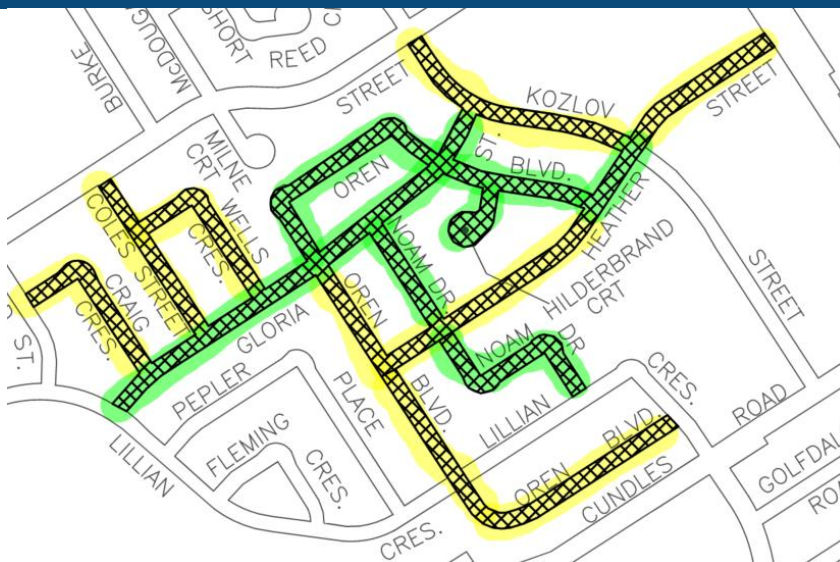

The City of Barrie (City) is continuing work on the Cundles Neighbourhood Resurfacing Program, being performed by Lisbon Paving Co. Limited (Contractor).

WORK UPDATE

The Contractor will continue progress by:

- Removing and replacing sections of damaged concrete curb and sidewalks, as required;
- Removing and replacing the asphalt roadway; and,
- Restoring driveways and boulevards impacted by the curb and sidewalk work.

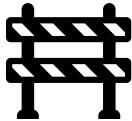
WHAT TO EXPECT

You may continue to experience inconveniences such as, dust, noise, and short delays. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts, and your patience is appreciated.

Further notice will be provided to property owners who are required to remove items such as decorative objects, located within City property limits (boulevard).

If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard portion of your property, please contact the City representatives identified below. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property, including sprinkler system.

	The Contractor has retained the services of GPM Environmental to complete a precondition survey of the exterior of your home. Separate letters will be sent from the City and the survey company to book an appointment.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: Pedestrian access will be maintained during construction. Roads will be open to traffic at all times, barring any unforeseen circumstances. Access for emergency vehicles will always be maintained.
	Driveway Access: Vehicle entry to properties within the construction limits will be available. At times, direct access to driveways will be interrupted, for concrete curb and/or sidewalk repairs and driveway restorations. Services: Hydro, sanitary sewer services, water services, telephone, cable TV, and gas services should not be affected by the construction, barring any unforeseen circumstances.

	Accessibility: If you have any accessibility requirements, such as wheelchair access or home care, please contact the City representatives listed below.
	Traffic Management: The Contractor will use traffic control measures, such as traffic cones to steer through traffic around contractor equipment and vehicles, within the construction site. Flag persons will assist with traffic control, if required.
	Transit Service: The proposed construction will not affect Barrie Transit routes, and schedules.
	Parking: Parking on roadways in an active construction area is not permitted. Vehicles parked in the construction zone will be ticketed and towed.
	Garbage and Recycling: Garbage, recycling, and yard waste will be collected on the regular collection day during construction. The Contractor may need to move items to a designated area for pickup by the City's waste contractor. Garbage cans, organics bins, and recycling boxes will be returned to your property later the same day. Clearly mark your address on all containers. Ensure everything for pick up is curbside by 7:00 a.m. on the collection day or it may not be picked up.
	Safety: The Contractor is required to conduct work in a safe manner, such as using traffic cones and fencing off excavations. Please use extra caution in the construction zone to ensure everyone's safety.

ASBESTOS IN ASPHALT:

As part of the construction work happening, the City must test the asphalt for asbestos. Our tests have identified that asbestos is present in the asphalt pavement on Gloria Street, Oren Boulevard, Noam Drive, Heather Street, and Hilderbrandt Court (highlighted in green on the map above), which are significantly below levels of concern to the Ministry of Labour.

Asbestos was used in asphalt mixes throughout the 1960s and early 1980s to improve the performance of the asphalt. The risk of exposure to asbestos for workers and bystanders is low. As a precaution, the City's contractor will follow these steps:

- Wet the pavement during asphalt cutting, grinding, and removal;
- Attach dust collecting devices with HEPA filters to equipment, where possible; to prevent dust from becoming airborne;
- Provide personal protective equipment, such as disposable coveralls and respirators, to on-site workers upon request; and,
- Transport and dispose of asphalt containing asbestos at provincially approved disposal sites.

Although there is very low risk to the public, residents can choose to keep their doors and windows closed and avoid the area during the time asphalt removal/cutting is taking place (usually one or two days during the overall asphalt repaving project). As well, you should not pick up loose pieces of asphalt from the roadway.
