

MAPLEVIEW DRIVE EAST ROAD EXPANSION (Yonge Street to Prince William Way)

START DATE: WINTER 2026

END DATE: SPRING 2028

The City of Barrie (City) is continuing work on the above noted project, with work being performed by Primrose Contracting (Ontario) Incorporated (Contractor). The project includes widening the roadway, improving intersections, building multi-use trails, and installing stormwater infrastructure.

WORK UPDATE

The Contractor will continue progress by:

- Reconstructing and widening Maplevue Drive East (from Yonge Street to Prince William Way) to four (4) through lanes with a centre median.
- Adding a multi-use trail on the north and south sides.
- Advancing work on the at-grade crossing of roadway and Metrolinx GO Rail Corridor.
- Implementing storm and sanitary sewers.
- Constructing new stormwater management pond and low impact development (LID) features.
- Removing and replacing the existing Hewitt's Creek box culvert.
- Upgrading traffic signals at Lily Drive and Kneeshaw Drive, and at the Royal Jubilee intersection.
- Improving the intersection at Yonge Street.
- Improving street lighting.

WHAT TO EXPECT

You may continue to experience inconveniences such as, dust, noise, and short delays. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts, and your patience is appreciated.








Further notice will be provided to property owners who are required to remove items such as decorative objects, located within City property limits (boulevard).

If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard portion of your property, please contact the City representatives identified below. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property, including sprinkler system.



Road and Sidewalk Access:

Maplevue Drive East, from Chef Lane to Royal Jubilee Drive/Lally Terrace, will be fully closed to through traffic from June 8, 2026, to November 20, 2026, to allow for the Hewitt's Creek culvert installation.

	<p>For public safety reasons, pedestrian access will not be maintained during the road closure.</p> <p>The City will post signage, as required, on how to access businesses.</p>
	<p>Driveway Access: Vehicle entry to properties within the construction limits will be available. At times, direct access to driveways will be interrupted for concrete curb and storm sewer work.</p> <p>Services: Hydro, sanitary sewer services, water services, telephone, cable TV, and gas services should not be affected by the construction, barring any unforeseen circumstances.</p>
	<p>Accessibility: If you have any accessibility requirements, such as wheelchair access or home care, please contact the City representatives listed below.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: The Contractor will use detour routes for traffic to reroute vehicles around the road closure via Yonge Street, Big Bay Point Road and Prince William Way.</p>
	<p>Transit Service: The proposed construction will affect Barrie Transit routes, and schedules. Changes to bus routes in the construction area will be posted in advance.</p> <p>A complimentary shuttle service will be provided on both sides of the road closure to help maintain access to the Barrie South GO Station and Maple Ridge Secondary School.</p> <p>See attached Mapleview Construction Shuttle map.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking on roadways in an active construction area is not permitted. Vehicles parked in the construction zone will be ticketed and towed.</p>
	<p>Waste Collection Garbage, recycling, organics, and yard waste will be collected on your regular collection day during construction. The Contractor may need to move items to a designated area for pick-up by the waste collection contractor. Carts and recycling boxes will be returned to your property later the same day. Clearly mark your address on all containers and, ensure everything for pick-up is curbside by 7:00 a.m. on the collection day.</p>
	<p>Safety: The Contractor is required to conduct work in a safe manner, such as using traffic cones and fencing off excavations. Please use extra caution in the construction zone to ensure everyone's safety.</p>

The City would like to thank all residents for their support and cooperation throughout this project. The City recognizes the impact this work may have on your daily routines and appreciates your understanding and patience throughout the project.
