

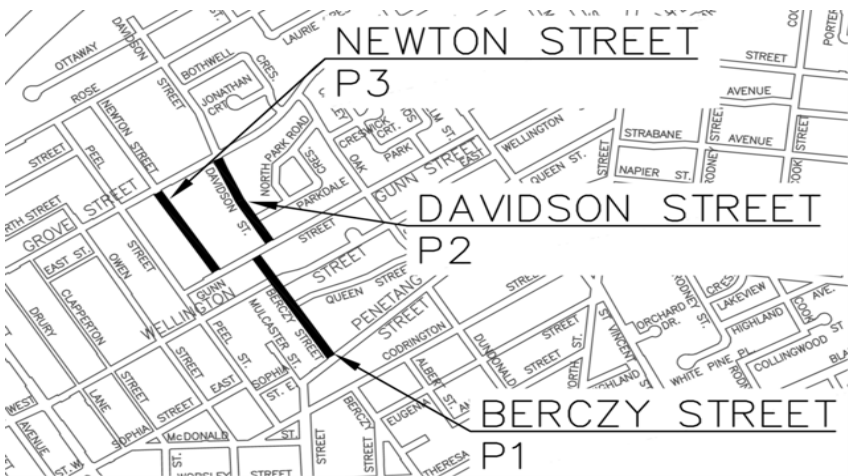
GROVE NEIGHBOURHOOD RESURFACING

START DATE: JUNE 2026
END DATE: OCTOBER 2026

The City of Barrie (City) will be resurfacing sections of roadway in the Grove Neighbourhood area and has awarded the contract to 1108575 Ltd O/A Kon-Strutt Construction.

This work is part of City Council’s approved 2026 budget and aligns with the Infrastructure Investments from their strategic direction.

WORK DETAILS

Kon-Strutt Construction will:

- Dig up the roadway
- Repair curbs
- Resurface the roadway
- Repair sidewalks
- Restore boulevards impacted by the work

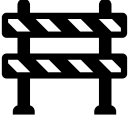
WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may experience inconveniences such as, dust, noise, and short delays. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts, and your patience is appreciated.

Further notice will be provided to property owners who are required to remove items such as decorative objects, located within City property limits (boulevard).

If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard portion of your property, please contact the City representatives identified below. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property, including sprinkler system.

	The Contractor has retained the services of GPM Environmental to complete a precondition survey of the exterior of your home. Separate letters will be sent from the City and the survey company to book an appointment.
	Road and Sidewalk Access: Pedestrian access will be maintained during construction. Roads will be open to traffic at all times, barring any unforeseen circumstances. Access for emergency vehicles will always be maintained.
	Driveway Access: Vehicle entry to properties within the construction limits will be available. At times, direct access to driveways will be interrupted. Services: Hydro, sanitary sewer services, water services, telephone, cable TV, and gas services should not be affected by the construction, barring any unforeseen circumstances.

	Accessibility: If you have any accessibility requirements, such as wheelchair access or home care, please contact the City representatives listed below.
	Traffic Management: The Contractor will use traffic control measures, such as traffic cones to steer through traffic around contractor equipment and vehicles, within the construction site. Flag persons will assist with traffic control, if required.
	Transit Service: The proposed construction will not affect Barrie Transit routes, and schedules.
	Parking: Parking on roadways in an active construction area is not permitted. Vehicles parked in the construction zone will be ticketed and towed.
	Garbage and Recycling: Garbage, recycling, and yard waste will be collected on the regular collection day during construction. Ensure everything for pick up is curbside by 7:00 a.m. on the collection day or it may not be picked up.
	Safety: The Contractor is required to conduct work in a safe manner, such as using traffic cones and fencing off excavations. Please use extra caution in the construction zone to ensure everyone's safety.

ASBESTOS IN ASPHALT

As part of the construction work happening on Newton Street, Berczy Street and Davidson Street, the City must test the asphalt for asbestos. Our tests have identified that low levels of asbestos are present in the asphalt pavement on Newton Street, Berczy Street and Davidson Street, which are significantly below levels of concern to the Ministry of Labour.

Asbestos was used in asphalt mixes throughout the 1960s and early 1980s to improve the performance of the asphalt. The risk of exposure to asbestos for workers and bystanders is low. As a precaution, the City's contractor will follow these steps:

- Wet the pavement during asphalt cutting, grinding or removal;
- Attach dust collecting devices with HEPA filters to equipment, where possible, to prevent dust from becoming airborne;
- Provide personal protective equipment, such as disposable coveralls and respirators, to on-site workers upon request, and
- Transport and dispose of asphalt containing asbestos at provincially approved disposal sites.

Although there is very low risk to the public, residents can choose to keep their doors and windows closed and avoid the area during the time asphalt removal/cutting is taking place (usually one or two days during the overall asphalt repaving project). As well, you should not pick up loose pieces of asphalt from the roadway.
