Vigil | November 10 | 7 p.m.–Midnight

During the ceremony, a Feu De d ie (blank
gunfire consisting of a rifle salute) will take
place. Two minutes of silence will be observed
at 11 a.m. followed by the ceremony and
laying of wreaths.

Wreaths

Reminder: removal of the wreaths will be on
Tuesday, November 15 at 4 p.m. (subject to
change). Any wreaths left onsite will be removed
on that day/time and be disposed of. Anyone
wishing to pick up their wreaths must do so
prior to.

The City honours, remembers and
commemorates Barrie's fallen soldiers by
featuring pictures of local veterans on flags
temporarily displayed throughout Meridian Place
and around the entire waterfront to Tiffin Street.

This year, 24 new flags were added to the
honourary series of Barrie's fallen soldiers.
The public can view the locations of each of the
flags using the Barrie's Fallen online map (via
barrie.ca/RemembranceDay).

The City invites residents to learn more
about Barrie's streets named in honour of
local soldiers, through the Poppies
on Street Signs online map (available via
barrie.ca/RemembranceDay).
