The City of Barrie is making voting **easy, accessible**, and **convenient**.

Are you eligible to vote?

To vote you must be

- √ A Canadian Citizen
- √ 18 years of age or older as of Oct 24, 2022
- ✓ A Barrie resident
- ✓ A Barrie property owner/tenant or spouse of Barrie property owner or tenant; and
- √ Not prohibited from voting by law

What offices are you voting for?

- ✓ Mayor
- √ Councillor
- ✓ School Board Trustee

Do you have your voting PIN?

A voter information letter containing your voting PIN together with other voting information will be mailed to you late September. Your voting PIN is required to access and submit your ballot in the Municipal Election.

If you haven't received your voter information letter by **October 7, 2022** call 705–728–VOTE (8683) or visit City Hall at 70 Collier Street, 1st Floor (Election Office).

Are you on the voters' list

Ensure that you are on the voters' list and that your information is correct.

- Visit the web address provided on your voter information letter
- ✓ Enter your voting PIN and required credentials
- ✓ Vote

- ✓ Call the phone number provided on your Voter Information Letter
- ✓ Enter your voting PIN and required credentials
- √ Vote

It is your democratic right to vote for the candidates of your choice.

Contact the Election Office (City Hall) immediately if you are asked to share your voting PIN via email, text, social media or in person.

If you have concerns about something contact us – the Election Office (City Hall) is here to help.

Contact the Election Office (City Hall) immediately to get a new voting PIN if you lose yours (the old PIN will be deactivated).

Never share your voting PIN – it's unique to you (candidates, law enforcement, city staff or anyone else should never ask for it).

It's illegal to vote using a voting PIN that is not yours.

You can't vote more than once in a municipality, no matter how many voting days there are or how many properties you own or rent.

Never post a photo or selfie with your ballot on social media or elsewhere – it's illegal.

Never use a candidate's mobile device/tablet to vote or share proof of whom you voted for with anyone.

A candidate **cannot** assist a voter in the voting process. If you require assistance please contact the Election Office.
